About Tiny Tots

The Tiny Tots group allow time for parents to connect and have a cup of tea while baby plays with a range of developmentally appropriate toys. The group also gather for music time in which the Listening and Spoken Language Specialist guides the families through a range of songs and rhymes. Families are provided with song and rhymes sheets to help them learn the words at home. Singing and music have many benefits for all children, but for babies who are deaf or hard of hearing the benefits are even greater. Song and rhyme help a baby's brain make the important connections for future learning. They form the foundations for language, literacy and mathematical learning.

Parents/caregivers

Parents/caregivers are required to sign the attendance sheet each week and are encouraged to wear a name tag to help families learn each other's names.

Parents are expected to be present during the Tiny Tots session. Staff and volunteers encourage parents to manage their children's behaviour in a positive way.

End of session

Can:Do 4Kids values the support of parents and appreciate assistance in cleaning and putting away resources after each session.

Snack time

Families are welcome to make a coffee or tea in the kitchen using safety coffee cups.

Funding

There are multiple funding options available. Speak to your therapist to find out the most suitable option for your child.

Staff

The group will be facilitated primarily by a Listening and Spoken Language Specialist, Speech Pathologist (with input from a Social Worker during some of the sessions.)

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
